LEARN HOW TO INVESTIGATE AUDIOVISUAL PIRACY Tuesday 18 June at 1500

Chaired by Sheila Cassells of AAPA, join Marlene Alvarez Vicente and Alejandro Fernando Gonzalez from the Grupo de Antipirateria of the Policia Nacional (Spain), and Mark Mulready and Kelly Pereira from AAPA member, Irdeto, in an interactive workshop where you will explore how to successfully investigate illegal streaming. The workshop is based on Operation Belenus which was focussed on a website based in Malaga, offering IPTV subscriptions with access to a multitude of international pay TV channels. It was subsequently revealed that the website was run by a specialised international criminal organisation with a presence in Spain, Denmark, United Kingdom, Latvia, the Netherlands and Cyprus.

Chris van Steenkiste, Head of Europol IPC3, will summarise the lessons learned. All attendees will receive a certificate.

On the Europol stand AAPA member, Sky, will demonstrate how illicit streaming devices work.
